I've been meeting with the committee since October, but I haven't had a lot of interaction with the library board, so I wanted to just introduce myself.

720 is the Dewey Decimal number for architecture.

We're located in Dallas and we've done a lot of work here in Louisiana, but libraries are our passion and we love going through this process.

For space and for services.

So this is our agenda.

We'll talk about the methodology and the amazing community input that we received.

And one of the first touch points was looking at the original goal for this project back in 2018 was to build a 13,500 square foot library with a 10,000 square foot warehouse.

A lot has changed since 20.

Construction cost has changed, the community has changed.

And so, but having that as the starting point was important.

We wanted to look at the service gaps, the Northeast region of Parish has a Recreation Center, but no other parish buildings. And So what are the cultural and educational opportunities outside of the schools that we could provide?

The basics what are the books?

We talked a lot about really understanding the culture of the Northeast region and we'll talk about this in the when we talk about the input with the Community. But.

At the Community Open House, we met with Wow women and the 100 men and people showed up and really talked about their passion for the community. And while it was an open house to stay and go, people really stayed and wanted to talk about what was important to.

That it be welcoming and inviting, that this building should open its arms to invite people in for education, for entertainment, perhaps disguise education, disguise as entertainment.

The committee talked to us about how important community engagement was because this is the first library for that region and we really took that to heart and you'll see that in how many people participated.

Technology. You'll hear that a lot in this presentation and read it a lot in the.

In the report that technology and bridging the digital divide for this region is one of the critical roles of a library branch here and then, just thinking about the exterior and the function, the aesthetics.

And what will make this building welcoming to people when they drive by?

They know it's a.

Do they know that they're invited in?

So in conjunction with the library team, the communications group.

Provided Flyers at all of the libraries for all of the events, there were press releases to television stations to radio stations, to newspapers.

I saw Danny get interviewed two or three times at the community input.

And we have 30 people come to the in person events.

We did three separate leadership groups where we met with representatives from the school district, from nonprofits, from business leaders, from.

Government leaders and then we did an online survey where we had almost 1200 people respond.

This is a picture from the open house at the Recreation Center, and you can see the presses there, people.

Are at the meeting talking about library possibilities?

We gave everyone five \$100 bills.

To slide into envelopes next to library spaces and services at.

Really made sense to this community.

00:36:05 Daniel Kelly8

And as part of that, there was a top ten list of priorities that were developed.

Number one children having a dedicated story time and activity space.

#2A technology training classroom.

So from the very basics, how do you use a mouse?

How do you send an e-mail to Excel and PowerPoint and higher level education opportunities?

#3 was back to science, technology, engineering, art and math.

This is a library in in Canada that has these stations that they roll out and there's microscopes on them and Jenga, all learning about.

Science and technology and engineering.

00:36:51 Daniel Kelly8

There was also a lot of comments about exterior spaces because of the location of the site connecting to the nature preserve. Having that opportunity for an outdoor story walk or outdoor walking path was really important.

And then recognizing that it is a beautiful site and there's opportunity for window seats and to take advantage of views.

Study rooms. This wasn't surprising in the libraries that we've done across the country.

Rooms are always in the top 10.

They're used for studying for job interviews, for webinars.

I've talked to college kids that take classes in the study rooms, Bible study, knitting, quilting.

But it's an endless number of uses for those types of spaces.

And then quiet.

So back to some of the traditional library spaces of being able to sit and quietly read and contemplate, but also places for the kids to interactively learn.

And then the last two were a tie for number 9 and 10 Amisa garden.

And then the last one, makerspace. So a place to be able to learn robotics.

From an online survey, we also developed a top ten list which is.

The community is really on the same page with study rooms, quiet reading.

Having a place to get a snack?

So if kids are coming to the library after school, they can get a little snack and a drink before they start studying or interacting with their peers.

More technology, outdoor seating, small groups, room craft rooms.

Teen area is number 8 and you'll understand why when we talk about the demographics of who responded to the survey, tutoring spaces and community gardens.

So where residents respondents live, so this is a chart showing the ZIP codes from all of the respondents you can see.

7051 is really the area right around the site.

00:39:29 Daniel Kelly8

70506 is just a little bit outside.

But there was a good response from people all across the parish who cared enough about library services across the parish.

To respond to the survey.

And then you can see the age distribution.

We've done a lot of these across the country and we typically see.

Most respondents between the ages of 30 and 49. These are generally families with children in school.

Big users of the library, but you can see on this survey under 18.

Really. Rock the boat.

They were off the charts.

00:40:16 Daniel Kelly8

The schools really participated strongly in the online survey.

00:40:21 Daniel Kelly8

They use this as a civics lesson in their classrooms to teach the kids about public participation.

00:40:27 Daniel Kelly8

And so this really speaks to why a teen area was so important in the responses that the teens were really engaged in this process, which is truly amazing.

So these are some of the themes from the leadership.

So really, understanding how a library can help with education with economic development, with making the region the best place to live, that it can be.

And what came up over and over again in all three of the focus groups was library as a central hub to the community.

And we heard that a lot in the in person open houses as well.

That this Community finds a place to meet, but having a really great place to meet is important.

Improved access. We've talked about that bridging the digital divide, STEM and steam.

Catering to the kids for early childhood learning and tutoring and creating a venue for celebrating local culture, people were really excited about having cultural events at the library, which is unique to.

Probably not Louisiana, but certainly libraries across the country.

And then they also wanted to talk about having natural light and vibrant colors and really celebrating the joy of a library space.

So in summary about the Community participation we had.

1200 Lafayette residents come out and share with us their thoughts about a library for the northeast.

Region and for a branch I will tell you that that is probably five times the next highest level of participation that we typically see.

So we're really excited about what the community had to say and that they took the time to come out and share it with us.

So the demographics and needs assessment.

A library rule of thumb for service is that people are generally willing to drive 3 miles or 20 minutes for a library services.

And so you can see from these blue lines that's the three mile radius.

For each of the libraries that we're talking.

00:43:09 Daniel Kelly8

And you can see the Northeast region branch in the upper right hand corner.

We used ursi numbers that were provided by the Parish Planning Department.

00:43:20 Daniel Kelly8

To determine a population of about 42,000 people over the next five years.

00:43:27 Daniel Kelly8

We know that the age of people that live in this region is younger than other areas of both Lafayette and Louisiana.

00:43:36 Daniel Kelly8

That it's about 73% black and 21% white.

00:43:41 Daniel Kelly8

Really diverse community.

00:43:44 Daniel Kelly8

The high school graduation rate is a little bit lower than Lafayette and so.

Bachelor's degree rate is also a little bit lower and so this talks to that real need for educational opportunities in the region.

And then related to education, the household income is significantly lower than the rest of Louisiana.

And so speaking again to the need for library services, the digital divide.

We also reference the state standards.

These are the collection numbers based on a three tiered standard that the state of Louisiana has for collection size and we did use the three mile radius. Although we show all 5.

All the one, the three and the five mile.

00:44:39 Daniel Kelly8

We also look at public access computers based on the standards.

00:44:43 Daniel Kelly8

So in addition to looking at the standards, because this region is a little different, we also looked at what are other libraries in the parish doing in terms of technology.

So at three, at a three mile radius population we're looking at and we don't want to do the lowest number because we know technology is really important to this community.

We need between 28 and 43 public.

Computers and you can see we haven't gotten to all of the options yet.

But the options all fall within that range between 22 and 34.

This is the standard for programming from the state of Louisiana.

It doesn't have a space and staff and services are all interconnected, and while this only talks about the number of events and programs that happen, the number of events and programs also affect the size of the room and the number of staff.

And so thinking about these 3 levels that the the.

State identifies for programming services.

So we took all of that information.

What the community said to us, the standards, what you're doing.

In the rest of the parish and developed 3 library space programs.

The largest program is the full wish.

Program. It has a sixty person community room that could be divisible.

It has a multipurpose classroom that could be used for technology training.

It has seven small group study rooms, a quiet reading room.

The highest level of public computers and dedicated staff space to provide all of the services.

Option 2 provides most of the community needs.

From their top ten list, it meets the Louisiana State Collection standards.

It still has a large community room and a multipurpose classroom.

It has a smaller number of study rooms 4 instead of 7.

It has 34PC24P CS instead of 36.

And it has a slightly reduced staff space.

And option three at 12,500 square feet is the option that meets the budget that was set in 2018.

It does meet the state collection standards. It has a smaller community room. It does not have a public multi purpose classroom for technology.

It only has two study rooms.

It has the lowest number of technology and a much reduced staff space in order to meet the budget from 2018. 00:47:48 Daniel Kelly8

And so we also looked at really high level at.

The next steps tonight we're presenting to you.

If a direction is given, the design could begin in March.

Thinking of this library as a community hub, having lots of ways for the community to use the space for educational and cultural events was a priority.

What is the cost to install something like that and also the maintenance?
